



- Perfect background colors (especially the white) to showcase vibrant Fun Stroke color designs on top.
- Light over dark can be achieved by applying several coats of a light colored Fun Stroke over a dark Surface Coat – try it, you'll be amazed by the results.
- Use Pottery Glazes and Surface Coats together for a unique effect and easy creation.
- Value-priced making them revenue generators.

SURFACE COAT TIPS

Apply 3 coats of

Surface Coats

- Apply three even coats. If you tend to be a heavy-handed painter then apply three thin coats or two heavy coats.
- Fun Writer bottles are great for designing with Fun Stroke colors on top of Surface Coats. Fun Writer coverage goes on with one coat. Fun Strokes fire right onto Surface Coats. No need to clear glaze.
- If you use a brush to design on top of Surface Coats - paint two to three coats of each Fun Stroke color.
- Surface Coats can be used as a base coat under pottery glazes. Black Top (SC-2609) is great under pottery glazes and White Board (SC-2600) works well over or under pottery glazes. You do not need any clear glaze, just paint and fire!
- You can use Surface Coats in place of Fun Strokes but you will have to closely butt all colors up to each other so there is no bisque showing especially on functional pieces. Surface Coats are probably not a good choice of paint for kids.
- Traffic Cone (SC-2605) orange is a great choice to cover pumpkins. And best of all you don't have to worry about dipping it. Red Carpet (SC-2608) is great for Christmas projects.
