Step 1- Apply 3 coats of Polar Bear to the tops of all the Bisques. Put aside.

Step 1- Apply 3 coats of Lime Light to the top side of the plate.

Step 3- Grab your template and cut out the outside circles of the eyes. Use the paper technique to apply them to the white Polar Bear Bisques. Apply a coat of Black Lab to the entire top side of the Bisque including the sides. Only let dry for about 5 to 10 minutes. Peel off the paper eyes so you just have black with big white eyes. Use a toothpick to etch lines into the black to show the white underneath. This is how you get all the furry lines in the spider. Do this with the line for the mouth also. Put the Bisques aside and go back to the plate.

Step 4- With a pencil, trace your pattern of the spider legs and bows onto your tissue paper. Place your tissue paper with the pattern on your plate. Use the water-based marker to re-trace the pattern onto the Lime Light. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper onto the plate. The marker will burn off in the kiln.

Step 5- On the plate, trace the inside of the eyes. Using the colors, Lime Ricky, Anchors Away, Rockin' Red, Orange Crush and Jumpin' Jelly, apply the colors to the iris of the eyes, the feet and the witch hat.

Step 6- Dip all 5 Bisques and the plate separately into clear glaze. Fire to a cone 06. You can place them on the plate and fire together or you can fire separately and glue on after.
